Achievements, Honors and Awards:

- Pitched for 46 years in T.A.A.F. fast pitch church and open softball
- Competed in 25 or more T.A.A.F. Church Fast Pitch State Championships
- Two (2) ISC Regional Tournaments and numerous ASA Tournaments
- His team won four (4) T.A.A.F. State Championships.
- Finished as T.A.A.F. Runner-Up Team 10 years and as Third Place seven (7) years
- Won one (1) ISC State Championship and finished runner-up
- His first 23 years were spent with several church teams: Azle Avenue Baptist and Trinity Free Will Baptist and the last 22 years were with Meadowbrook Methodist.
- While on the Meadowbrook Methodist team:
 - 1972 - Named MVP and presented the Dalton Walker Award
 - 1987 - Won the ISC Regional Championship @ Grand Prairie
 - 1988 - Helped pitch the team to its first World Tournament
- Pitched a total of 794 games, winning 550 and losing 244
- He won thirty (30) or more games seven (7) years and twenty (20) or more games for sixteen of the twenty-two years.
- He won forty-one (41) games in 1973.
- During the 22 years, the team won four (4) state championships, nine (9) second place, six (6) third place and four (4) fourth place.
- He was named All State four (4) times, the state's Most Valuable Pitcher three (3) times, and All Tournament many times.
- During his forty-six (46) year career it is estimated that he pitched in over 1700 games winning over a thousand games.
