

## **Dick Bartel**



- Played baseball, softball, basketball and golf in US Army stationed at El Paso.
- Drafted by the Montreal Expos baseball organization.
- 1972 Started to play slow pitch softball in the San Antonio PARD league.
- Played for Anchor Lounge, Ray Carpenter Construction and C.C. Brick & Lumber Company during career in San Antonio.
- 1973 Anchor Lounge finished second at the T.A.A.F. State Men's Open Slow Pitch Championship in Pasadena, Texas.
- 1975 Anchor Lounge won at the T.A.A.F. State Men's Open Slow Pitch Championship in Austin, Texas.
- 1978 C.C. Brick won the T.A.A.F. State Men's Open Slow Pitch Championship in Amarillo, Texas.
- 1973 1979 Played in all of the T.A.A.F. State Men's Open Softball Championships.
- He was selected to seven (7) T.A.A.F. All Tournament Teams.
- Received two (2) T.A.A.F. Most Valuable Player awards.
- Received San Antonio league's "All City", "City MVP", and "City Home Run" honors most of these years.
- Participated in nine (9) ASA National Men's Slow Pitch Championship Tournaments. (Teams include Ray Carpenter Construction; C.C. Brick & Lumber; Campbell's Carpets of Concord, CA; Howard's Furniture / Western Steer of Denver, NC).
- His teams won four (4) ASA National Championships and finished second twice.
- Selected to six (6) ASA National Championship All Tournament Teams.
- His teams won two (2) USSSA World Championships.
- Selected to four (4) USSSA All World Teams.
- 1981 Won the State ASA Home Run Derby Championship.
- 1981 Won the National ASA Home Run Derby Championship.
- During four years with Howard's, team won ASA National Championship in 81, 83 & 84; Bartel earned first-team ASA All American Honors 4 times; had a batting average of .654; hit 580 Home Runs and drove in 1,090 runs.
