I aspire to be self-sufficient and successful in my career, but also inspire other young, female aviators to see the world, accomplish their goals, and reach their dreams, from the flight deck and beyond.

I am thrilled to spend my college years learning to navigate the friendly skies and as I move into my next chapter of life, I am looking to build a livelihood that will not only be diverse and fulfilling but also allow for time for involvement in the youth, political, business world, as well. I would even love to be a youth sports coach one day soon. A college degree certainly allows for more opportunity in the workforce and diversity in knowledge and skillset, which is why I chose to go the university route for my aviation career. I believe knowledge is power and I wanted to take every educational opportunity I could.

I placed 4th at regionals, qualifying for state in the 300m hurdles. I then put in consistent work on my own in the summer mornings leading up to the state competition. This allowed me to come back thriving with an over 3 second PR and a 5th place finish in the TAAF Summer Games. Using my setback as motivation to work hard and better myself proved very fruitful.


